From the 5th to the 8th of January, an annual gathering of game and game music fans takes place at a magical convention called MAGFest. MAGFest, as described by the event's organizers, is a 4-day party celebrating video and tabletop gaming with a special emphasis on their music. For those days, the halls of the Gaylord National Resort and Convention Center in National Harbor, Maryland, fill up with musicians, gamers, fans of Danny DeVito(?), and icons of pop culture cosplayed by the incredibly talented people who craft elaborate representations of their favorite fandoms. You can't look in any direction without seeing a myriad of Italian plumbers, pocket monsters, one-winged angels, stormtroopers and Mandalorians, comic book heroes, and every anime personality you know and didn't know that you didn't know. Anywhere you stand, you'll hear music. It may come from a guy dressed as a Hylian man in a green tunic playing an ocarina in the hallway, a group of bards singing about their D&D adventures in the lobby, or one of the many incredible musical acts that performs on the main stage. I was fortunate enough to be invited to play with the Game Brass at MAGFest this year and perform a set of game tunes on that main stage. Normally, the group is a standard quintet who are not unfamiliar with the convention. This year, they decided to add a few people and make a bigger brass choir and I was lucky enough to know the horn player from college, leading to my invitation. It took me, my wife, Naomi (TBS, Xi alumni and KKPsi, Alpha Psi honorary member), and our friend, Grace (TBS Xi member) two days to get from Amarillo, TX to Maryland, a 28-hour drive, to get there, but everything about it was worth the effort. After a few rehearsals, meeting as a group in person for the first time that week, the Game Brass played music from Halo, Super Smash Bros., The Legend of Zelda, Celste, Castlevania, and Chrono Trigger to an enthusiastic audience that made you feel like you were Elton John or something. It was the most energizing experience I've had as a horn player, one that will remain in my memory for the rest of my days.

While the performance was the highlight of the trip, there was plenty else to do at MAGFest. In between rehearsals, there were panels about game music theory, panels about history of the Star Wars Old Republic, game shows with internet celebrities, cosplay contests, arcades, museums, the marketplace where I spent way too much money, and of course, performances. We even got to meet a couple of my favorite composers! Tee Lopes, composer of Sonic Mania and the recently released, TMNT: Shredder's Revenge, was just enjoying a drink and one of the performers at the lobby bar! The other, Austin Wintory, an Emmy nominee for his soundtrack to Journey among others like Assassin's Creed: Syndicate, was at an autograph signing and then later, eating breakfast in the table behind us one day! That kind of thing can only happen at MAGFest! They were both very kind as I gushed about how much their music meant to me and made it to where I came back with some souvenirs - signed copies of some of the games they worked on!

As I've been mentioning, there is a special emphasis on music. We watched a ton of concerts, but the biggest highlight was the 8-Bit Big Band who recently won a whole Grammy for one of their arrangements of Meta Knight's Revenge from Nintendo's Kirby series which was the first time any video game thing won a Grammy, by the way! Watching a big band and jazz orchestra play music from Portal, Mario Kart 8, Metal Gear Solid 3, and a ton others was electric. Nothing gets us dorks going more than hearing "Bob-omb Battlefield" from Super Mario 64 performed live!

There is so much more I could talk about, but I'll leave it at that. Getting to spend those days there, surrounded by games and music was incredible. If you're into either of those things, even a little bit, I highly recommend MAGFest. You're guaranteed a good time.
